# How is "Getting kids to cooperate" different from "making kids obey"?

- 1. Group's ideas first:
- 2. Working together as a team toward win/win solutions.
- 3. Children are *self*-motivated to cooperate for the *internal* payoffs received.

Three Reasons to Avoid *External* Motivators (like bribes, rewards, praise, incentives and sticker charts) \* I'm planning a teleseminar just on this topic.

They work as a quick fix but in the long run:

- They are *addictive*; eventually, there must be an incentive to motivate,
- The bribe/incentive *must continually get bigger/better*,
- The person has to *want* the bribe


#### **Power Struggles**


If there's not a choice about <u>IF</u> it is going to happen, offer choices for <u>WHEN</u> or <u>HOW</u>

Tips for Personalities:

"Union Negotiator": <u>Set bottom line and let child come up with choices</u>

"Indecisive": <u>Hold them to that choice & remind them they can choose different next time</u>





## **More Cooperation Tools**

| 2. Don't Say <u>Don't</u>          |                              |
|------------------------------------|------------------------------|
| Finish the sentence: Ask for ideas | Instead: describe what TO do |
| Don't                              | <del>Don't</del>             |
| Stop                               | Stop                         |
| Ovit                               | Onit                         |

- 3. No No's. Instead:
- Give a conditional 'yes.'
- Offer an acceptable alternative.
- State a reason or give information
- Recognize feelings.
- Save "no" for dangerous issues or emergencies.
- 4. Plan Ahead & Get agreements
- 5. Use <u>humor</u> Make it <u>child-friendly</u>
